AUXILIARY Celebrates 75 YEARS OF EXCEPTIONAL SUPPORT

In 1937, Pomona Valley Hospital Medical Center (PVHMC) administrators, prominent physicians, and community leaders approached their wives with an appeal that would have far-reaching benefits for the Hospital and the community: "We need an Auxiliary." Twenty four women responded, creating a non-profit organization dedicated to volunteer service, fund raising and community assistance.

This fall the PVHMC Auxiliary – almost 500 strong – celebrates its 75th year of providing crucial support to the Hospital and its patients.

In April the Auxiliary presented the Hospital with a check for \$100,000, representing funds raised in 2011, primarily proceeds from the Tender Touch Gift Shop and the Holiday Homes Tour. The gift is part of the Auxiliary's pledge to raise \$1 million toward the future construction and renovation of Hospital facilities.

During 2012, our hope is to create a greater awareness that Pomona Valley Hospital Medical Center has the finest doctors, nurses and Hospital staff available 24 hours a day to meet the healthcare needs of this community, and that only through continued philanthropic support can the Hospital grow.

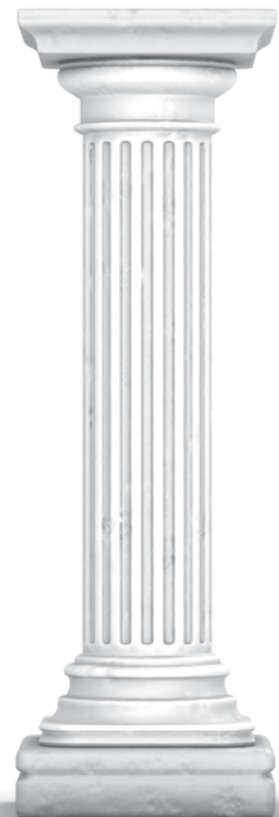
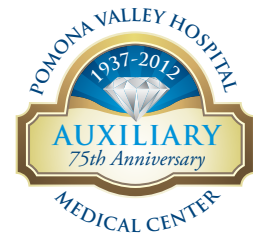
“It was very, very important that we support the Hospital with this pledge,” said John Mata, president of the Auxiliary in 2008, when the pledge was made. “It’s a challenge but we felt it was necessary to make this commitment because there’s a need. The money will be used to improve our facilities, reach out to our community, and advance medical care.”

Each year the Auxiliary donates approximately \$100,000 toward meeting the pledge, in addition to contributing \$30,000 - \$40,000 throughout the year to aid other programs and departments in the Hospital through the Auxiliary’s Sick Baby and Hospital Assistance Fund. Started in 1941, the fund continues to be the Auxiliary’s way of fulfilling requests made by Hospital departments throughout the year. Donations, fund-raising activities and the annual Holiday Homes Tour all add to the bottom line. In fact, the Auxiliary is the largest donor to Pomona Valley Hospital Medical Center.

These efforts have also included renovation of the pediatric playroom, providing car seats for new babies born at the Hospital when parents can’t afford one, purchasing needed equipment for the NICU, providing clothing for emergency room patients and much more. The Auxiliary also gives \$12,000-\$20,000 each year in college scholarships to Hospital student volunteers studying to enter the medical field.

In addition to these vital gifts, an essential part of the Auxiliary’s service is volunteering. The Auxiliary is comprised of all the Hospital’s adult volunteers. They, together with student volunteers, give approximately 100,000 hours a year of service to the Hospital.

“Our volunteers are proud to belong to a Hospital which has received so many awards for superior quality care and customer satisfaction, and we like to think we help contribute to that.” said Marcia Paetau, Auxiliary president. “Each time a volunteer can address the basic needs of a patient or lighten the load for the staff, we free them to provide maximum care for those patients who need it most.”

Stacy Mittelstaedt, Director of Volunteer Services and a member of the Auxiliary Board, explains how volunteers fulfill a wide variety of duties throughout the Hospital that are not provided by licensed health professionals or paid employees. “Delivering newspapers, assisting patients with their meal selection cards, driving the Hospital shuttle, staffing the gift shop, providing directions, holding and rocking newborn babies, sitting with sick patients whose family members can’t be there, staffing the Hospital’s information desks and offering smiles to those who desperately need them are just a few of the ways volunteers contribute.”

One of the Hospital’s most honored and long-time volunteers is Jane Goodfellow, who was recently elected 2012-2013 Chairman of the PVHMC Board of Directors. She is the first female Board Chairman in the Hospital’s 109-year history and the first Board Chairman who is also an active volunteer. Jane has volunteered in the Hospital’s surgical recovery room for four hours every other week for the past 29 years.

“I’m very honored to be elected as Chairman of the PVHMC Board of Directors,” she said. “I especially want to recognize the many capable women – and men – who volunteer at the Hospital in every capacity. I feel the Hospital is a better place because of them.”

Tony Spano calls volunteering “therapy for the heart and soul.” Tony, a Hospital Board member and Auxiliary president in 2009-2010, has volunteered at the Hospital for the past 10 years.

“Patients and family members are often scared when they come to the Hospital,” he said. “Having the volunteers just listening to their concerns helps make their stay less stressful. The Hospital can take care of the medical needs, and the volunteers help with the emotional needs.”

New EQUIPMENT FOR OUR NEWEST PATIENTS — MOTHERS MILK IS THE BEST

*P*omona Valley Hospital Medical Center has embarked upon a crusade to make sure that nothing prevents mothers from doing the most important thing they can to give their newborns a strong start: *breastfeed*. This has been made possible from a generous donation from a local family foundation.

In 2009, Hospital leaders decided to pursue Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations-(JCAHO) designation as a Baby-Friendly Hospital in accordance with standards set forth by the United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF) and the World Health Organization. Using a grant from the statewide child advocacy organization First 5 LA, the effort included 16 hours of training for all obstetric and neonatal staff on how to articulate the benefits of breastfeeding to new moms. It also included forgoing the distribution of free formula to mothers who expressed an interest in breastfeeding exclusively as well as discouraging

pacifier use after birth and daily rounding by a lactation expert.

“We’re changing the way people are thinking,” said Susan Miller, RN, nurse manager of obstetric services. “Many people believe formula is okay, but we want to let (mothers) know that breastfeeding really is the best thing for them and for their babies.”

As the Medical Center prepares for its Baby-Friendly evaluation in 2013, clinicians in the NICU also have mounted an effort to make sure that immediate and exclusive breast milk is available for babies who are frequently too sick to breastfeed. Thanks to a \$100,000 grant from the Ludwick Family Foundation, the NICU is equipped with the necessary equipment to enhance the breastfeeding experience for mothers with premature babies.

“Our biggest job is protecting mom’s milk supply for when the baby is ready,” said Children’s Services Director, Michele Atkins-Young, RN, adding that as premature babies are getting stronger they often receive mother’s milk through a feeding tube. Two new freezers were funded by the Ludwick Family Foundation to keep breast milk frozen.

“That first portion of the breast milk is the most precious,” Michele said. “It’s like gold to the baby. It has all the necessary nutrients to help build the infant’s immunity.”

The Ludwick grant also enabled the Hospital to refurbish the mother’s lactation rooms, purchase new breast pumps designed specifically for use during the baby’s recovery in the NICU, and install waterless milk warmers for all 55 NICU bed spaces. Without the milk warmers nurses would have to spend extra time defrosting the milk in a tub of warm water, going back and forth to perform touch tests to make sure the milk did not overheat.

“Now, the milk is defrosted to the perfect temperature within 30 minutes, and it’s right at the patient’s bedside,” Michele said. “We try to remove any barriers for nurses to do the right thing and make it as convenient as possible.”

Hospital efforts to promote breastfeeding already have shown glowing results: breast milk usage in the NICU jumped from 44.3 percent in 2009 to 56.8 percent in 2010 and remained stable.

“The Ludwick Family Foundation supports organizations that help families and children,” said Trista Campbell, the Foundation’s program manager. When the Medical Center submitted the grant to help mother’s breastfeed premature babies, “it hit right at the heart.”

FAMILY HONORS 1ST BIRTHDAY WITH SPECIAL GIFT TO THE NICU

A child's first birthday is a very special occasion. Zoey Perez's family and friends honored her first year of life with a gift of \$705 to PVHMC Foundation for the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).

Zoey spent her first month of life in PVHMC's NICU, and her parents, Victoria and Joseph are forever grateful for the excellent care their daughter received, and are enjoying spending time with the active and healthy 1 year old.

LUDWICK FAMILY FOUNDATION GRANT ALREADY PROVING INVALUABLE

A generous grant from the Ludwick Family Foundation, which enabled the PVHMC Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) to acquire specially designed medical freezers where mothers may store breast milk that is later used to nourish their sick babies, has proven invaluable to at least one local family.

On March 27, Jack Stratton was born slightly premature to parents Laura and Casey Stratton of Claremont. Doctors diagnosed him with respiratory distress syndrome and admitted him to the NICU, where a ventilator was used to assist his breathing.

Because early breast milk is full of important antibodies that the Stratton's wanted Jack to receive, staff went the extra mile to make sure it happened. A hospital-grade pump, also made available by the Ludwick Family Foundation grant, was provided, instruction was given, and Laura pumped every three hours during Jack's hospitalization. He initially received breast milk through a feeding tube, but after his strength increased he began receiving his mother's milk through bottles provided in the NICU.

"It's been great," Laura said. "Not only does the hospital store my milk, but they labeled and numbered the bottles from the beginning to make sure Jack received the all-important early milk. A lactation expert provided instruction, and the hospital supplies all the bottles and equipment we need. It's really been amazing to have the milk on hand even if I'm not in the room."

With Jack receiving breast milk (through a bottle and by directly breastfeeding), his health improved dramatically. He was moved from the primary NICU on the first floor up to the less acute NICU on the third floor, and his family took him home in mid-April. The Ludwick Family Foundation grant has truly been a blessing for the Stratton's.

"Jack is really doing great," Laura said. "Everyone has been very supportive—the level of care that we've received as a family has been above and beyond anything we could ever have expected. We are so fortunate that this is the hospital where my doctor wanted us to deliver."

AND VASCULAR CENTER PUTS PATIENT CARE AT THE HEART OF ITS WORKS

Pursuing a mission of providing patients with access to the highest quality and most state-of-the-art cardiac and vascular services in the region, the Stead Heart and Vascular Center at Pomona Valley Hospital Medical Center (PVHMC) has celebrated a string of recognitions, awards and distinctions in its 25 years of existence.



Ironically, the Center's goal has never been one of achieving awards, but instead has been focused squarely on achieving the best possible care and outcomes for each patient treated at the Center.

Now in 2012, the Stead Heart and Vascular Center stands poised to fully realize its vision of maintaining an ongoing commitment to quality outcomes and patient-centered approaches that assures the most

comprehensive and coordinated care, from prevention and diagnosis to treatment and rehabilitation.

Stead Heart and Vascular Center Director, Deborah Keasler, R.N., notes that “during the past 25 years, we have responded to patient’s needs, expanding from a heart surgery center to include a vascular center, a heart failure program with some of the top outcomes in the nation and a health, a stroke center and an all-inclusive cardiac rehabilitation program that helps patients, supported by trained staff, to prevent a reoccurrence of heart and vascular symptoms.”

Deborah—who is in charge of the day-to-day operation of the Center, assuring the quality of treatment, and building the Center’s capabilities as new knowledge, technology and treatments are developed—notes that it’s an exciting time in heart and vascular care as new technologies are revolutionizing all facets of services the center provides.

One area where the Stead Heart and Vascular Center is making great strides is in electrophysiology. “Electrophysiology allows us to map the electrical current in the heart so that we can work to prevent cardiac arrhythmia, or irregularities in a person’s heartbeat” Deborah explains.

The work has resulted in the Center’s addition of five Electrophysiologists through an affiliation with UCLA Medical Center.

FIRST CARDIAC CATH PATIENT – BARBARA RISKAS

In October of 1986, Barbara Riskas of Claremont was the first patient at the new Stead Heart Center's Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory.

In the early 1970s Barbara experienced a "funny sensation within her body." She was seen by a Los Angeles cardiologist who found nothing amiss.

In the early 1980s Barbara began experiencing pain in her jaw, neck, left arm and in her carotid artery. Having recently moved to the Pomona Valley, Barbara saw local cardiologist, Dr. Rama Thumati.

With her symptoms continuing to occur intermittently, Dr. Thumati performed an angiogram in the Hospital's new Cardiac Cath Lab. He found a bulge on the side of one of Barbara's arteries. Blood was coagulating there and when the pooled blood burst loose it caused the pain and odd sensations that Barbara experienced.

The diagnosis was Coronary Artery Disease and Barbara has taken medication since 1986 to manage the disease. Today, Barbara continues to enjoy an active lifestyle with her husband, Mike, their two adult children and six grandchildren. "Little did I know when I was on the gurney going into the cardiac cath lab that I would be here 25 years later talking about it," shared Barbara.

Stead Heart and Vascular Center puts patient care at the heart of its works

Another important innovation the Center has followed over time, is that "heart surgeries are becoming much less invasive," says Deborah, noting that procedures similar to angiograms can now be used to perform surgeries that previously would have required opening the chest. "This not only decreases recovery times, but also offers better outcomes overall," Deborah says.

The Heart and Vascular Center also has made great strides in cardiac telemetry monitoring. "We have one of largest telemetry monitoring programs in the region," Deborah points out, emphasizing the Center has worked cooperatively with other units in the Hospital to expand its telemetry capacity to 64 beds and the demand continues. "Our community has a growing need for cardiovascular care which, if we had more funding, could increase our telemetry unit," said Deborah.

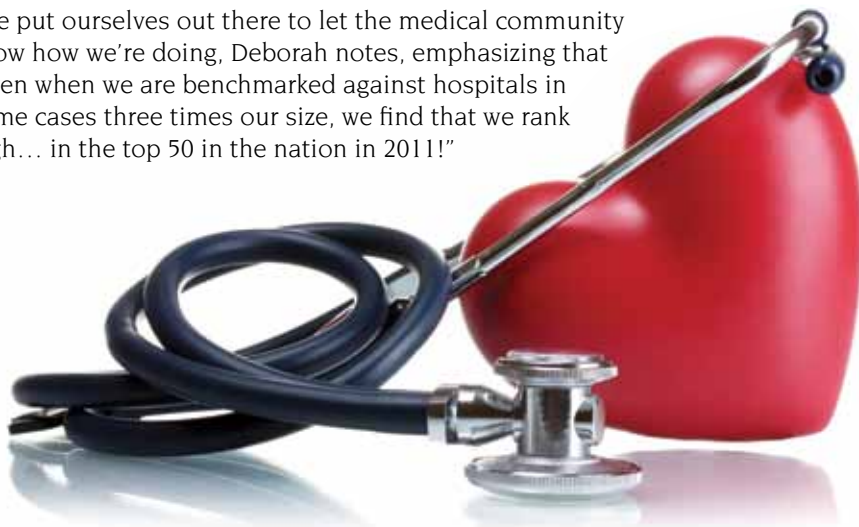
In addition to staying at the leading edge of heart and vascular care for patients treated at the Hospital, one of the key components of the Center's work is "reaching out to our community to serve its needs as well," Debbie explains.

"In recent years we've been doing more outreach, to educate more people about heart disease, risk factor modifications, and making connections between science and wellness," Deborah offers, adding that she is especially pleased with a program to raise awareness and increase knowledge about the use of Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) among area youth.

"Once participants have had the experience of practicing use of an AED, they have that 'muscle memory' that may lead to their having a part in saving a person's life." She explains, adding "and it's a great thing to be a part of that."

It's also satisfying for Deborah to see the Hospital be honored with national and regional awards and distinctions. "To help ensure quality outcomes for our patients, we participate in national registries for cardiac catheterization labs, cardiac surgeries and treatment of heart failure, acute myocardial infarction, and stroke," she explains.

"We put ourselves out there to let the medical community know how we're doing, Deborah notes, emphasizing that "even when we are benchmarked against hospitals in some cases three times our size, we find that we rank high... in the top 50 in the nation in 2011!"



Bill Stead appreciates our multifaceted approach including peer assessment, pursuit of the latest technology and treatment, and community education and outreach. Since giving a gift of real estate some 27 years ago to help fund the Center, Bill and his wife, Carole, have been pleased to see the Center grow.

“We feel privileged to have had the opportunity to give the hospital staff the tools to do their important life-saving work, but it’s their brains, and their hands, and their hearts that have led to the Center’s many accomplishments,” Bill, a member of the Hospital’s Board of Directors, insists.

“You know,” shares Bill, “my dad received the first pacemaker placed by this Hospital, and the fact that the Heart Center we named in his and my mom’s memory continues to grow, is evidence of its commitment to offering the most dedicated and cutting-edge care.”

And that commitment promises a future where the Stead Heart and Vascular Center “can build on the excellent foundation we’ve laid, while maintaining the highest quality patient care” declares Debbie, adding that “we will continue to be a leader in heart and vascular care in the region, advancing our legacy of cutting edge treatment coupled with heartfelt caring.”

A HOSPITAL WITH A HEART

As a Pomona Valley Hospital Medical Center (PVHMC) board member and emeritus board member of PVHMC Foundation, and as a donor who helped establish the Stead Heart and Vascular Center, it matters to me that the Hospital offers its patients cutting-edge health care using the latest medical technology and best practices.

But as a community member with a long history connecting me and my family to PVHMC, it also matters to me that the Hospital offers all its patients heartfelt service at a facility that truly cares for its community.

I was born at Pomona Valley Hospital in 1929, and my parents—dad was a Hospital board member and mom as a founding member of the Auxiliary—gave many hours to help the Hospital pursue its vision of community healthcare. So it’s no surprise that I care deeply about the Hospital and the community it serves.

What may be surprising is the many different ways the Hospital’s Administration, Associates and Volunteers go beyond simply providing the best in health care. They offer deeply-felt, compassionate caregiving for our patients and for the larger community PVHMC serves.

The Hospital’s Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, for example, is able to offer the most cutting-edge care for premature infants with equipment financed by a grant from the Ludwick Family Foundation. The staff there goes beyond the technology to offer the kind of dedicated caregiving families need.

Programs like the PVHMC Family Health Center’s *Reach Out and Read* program—which offers encouragement, reading opportunities and books for young patients and their parents—show that caring for patients is about more than their medical needs.

As a community-based Hospital, PVHMC is there to serve the people of this region and I’m pleased to see that we’re

not restricting our work to medical treatments, but also making efforts to improve our patients’ total well-being and quality of life.

The Stead Heart and Vascular Center is near and dear to my heart and I’m so proud of their accomplishments. Not only is it one of the top 50 cardiovascular centers in the nation, it’s also been ranked in the top 5% for patient care.

My wife and I have been on the receiving end of both the quality care and compassionate caregiving provided by PVHMC, not only as patients at the Hospital, but also through the care PVHMC Associates provided to our son, Brad, who passed away from throat cancer two years ago. The doctors, nurses and other Hospital Associates went out of their way to help and comfort us through it, and we feel very grateful.

Because so many patients and family members have had these kinds of positive experiences, the Foundation now offers the Guardian Angel Program, which allows donors to show their gratitude by honoring a specific staff member or unit with a gift to support the Hospital’s important work.

I, of course, want to see the Hospital continue to provide the best care there is, and when organizations and individuals tell me about the outstanding and caring treatment PVHMC provides, I feel good to be connected to an organization that’s got such a good heart.

'REACH OUT AND READ' IMPROVES HEALTH THROUGH LITERACY

Because clinicians play a vital role in encouraging parents to read aloud to their children, Pomona Valley Hospital Medical Center (PVHMC) has joined nearly 5,000 programs nationwide to offer "Reach Out and Read" to the community.

Under the program, parents who bring their children to the PVHMC Family Health Center for routine wellness visits will receive clinical advice as well as information on the health benefits of reading aloud with their children.

"When children are educated and ready to go to school, those qualities have a long-term impact on their health," said Darlene McPherson, RN, PhD, director of operations at the Family Health Center.

Literacy level is a key socioeconomic indicator that can determine health status in later years, she added.

"Some parents are a little surprised, however it's part of our exam routine. We talk about exercise, limiting the child's time with television and video games, and the importance of reading. Most people wouldn't associate that with health status, but all of these have a huge impact on children."

With support from PVHMC Foundation, the Family Health Center is able to give families an age-appropriate book for children aged 6 months through 5 years. Most books are purchased with funding from the "Reach Out and Read" organization while others have been donated by Scholastic, Inc. So far, more than 20 families have received books, most of which appeal to the center's predominantly Latino population. Darlene said that offering books in both English and Spanish further equips parents who speak limited English to read aloud to their children.

"Research shows that when clinicians encourage parents to read aloud as part of their efforts to rear healthy children, moms and dads are more likely to listen," Darlene said. "It has a different spin coming from a doctor or a nurse—parents take it a little more seriously."

The center also received financial support from the Foundation through proceeds raised at its annual wine tasting, to create a reading space in the Family Health Center's waiting room, decorated with new tables, chairs, bookcases and a colorful story mural. Parents and children have access to a library of more than 220 books while they wait to see their clinician.

"The Foundation has been instrumental in creating this," Darlene added. "As long as we're seeing patients, we want to keep the program going."

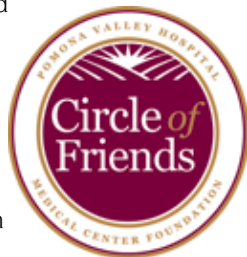

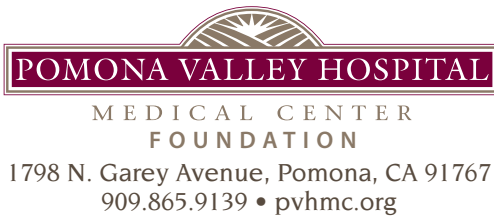
